An international level online webinar was also held jointly by English department and Hindi department of the college on 28 June 2020. The topic of the webinar was problems encountered in education during covid-19 and solutions. Three respected speakers were invited to speak and share their expertise and suggestions with both faculty members of different colleges as well as students. Dr. Alka Dunputh from Mauritius spoke on problems faced during online education during covid-19 period and told us how online education was conducted in Mauritius. She apprised us about how not only teachers but also the other members of the community made a team effort to impart education to the students. She also addressed various queries of the students and told them to increase their skills so that it will make them employable.

Dr Alka Dhunputh is creative Head of the department of creative writings and publication of Mahatma Gandhi International University Mauritius. She was the keynote speaker on the occasion. She asked the faculty members to not lose their confidence and face the new normal in education with conviction. The next speaker was Dr. Deepa Manga Bharti from Guru Jambheshwar University, Hisar. She is currently Associate professor in MBA department of the university. She also spoke about various problems that are being faced during covid-19 online education. She beseeched the faculty members and administrative staff to show a sympathetic and humanistic approach towards the student in this traumatic time. She also implored students to be alert, smart and renovate their thinking by discovering new avenues of employment rather than going to conventional means such as government jobs. She also told them to leave their comfort area so that they are able to explore new areas. The third speaker was a doctor, Dr. Dinesh Gupta, who is presently working actively in managing covid-19 crisis. He is Nodal Officer of covid-19 dedicated hospital at Narnaund. He spoke about various precautions that teachers and students should take when college opens how they should conduct themselves so that they do not contact any disease. The session ended with a Question-answer session. The session was a very helpful to the students and very informative for all of us.

The English and the Hindi department jointly conducted a a webinar with the final year students during the Lockdown period. The teachers, Dr. Sudha Malhotra, Dr. Geeta along with the principal of our college Mrs. Anita Singroha resolved and shared concerns of the students and also informed them about the latest assessment pattern of the CRSU university. This meeting was conducted on Google meet and it was an eyeopener experience for the students as well as the teachers.

The principal madam of the college advised the girls to remain connected to the college through WhatsApp group and asked them to take precautions regarding covid-19. She told them to maintain hygiene and take proper safeguards so that they can remain healthy and safe.

During lockdown period, she suggested them to be alert and boosted their morale and told them to utilise their time. Dr. Sudha Malhotra also talked to the students and told them to be happy, mindful and to be helpful to their parents.

She told them that they should maintain a routine and help their parents in this difficult time.

They should not get depressed, rather they should utilise their time in doing fruitful work. She also guided them and answered their queries regarding college work, assessment and personal problems.

Dr. Geeta Gupta talked about assessment pattern of the CRSU University and various moo courses available on the internet for the students. She acquainted them with the spoken English classes online. She asked them not to waste their time as it is a great time for them to learn new things.

She told students about more than 600 new courses which were going to be started on Swayam portal-which has been opened by MHRD. She told them that during the lockdown period when students are not able to go to colleges and other institutions, it is boon for them to assess this portal and enrol themselves in any new course which they like. More than 600 courses were available. They should join the course and upgrade their knowledge.
