

## N.S.S. Annual Activity Report (Session 2025-26)

The National Service Scheme empowers youth through voluntary community service, fostering essential personality development and character building. By merging academic learning with hands-on social initiatives and rural development, students bridge the gap between education and social responsibility. The annual activities given below cultivate leadership and civic duty under the selfless motto "Not Me, But You":

### July 2025

- **22 July 2025:** Volunteers were officially honoured and disseminated for the **ELPs registration process on the My Bharat Portal** to streamline youth engagement and digital documentation.
- **28 July 2025:** Two students, Yashika and Neha from B.A. 2nd year, participated in the **Tiranga Yatra from Haryana to Jammu & Kashmir**, held from 10 to 15 August to celebrate Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.

### August 2025

- **13-14 August 2025:** Under the **Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign**, a "Selfie with Tiranga" initiative was successfully conducted with enthusiastic participation from both volunteers and staff members.
- **15 August 2025:** Students joined a **Tiranga Yatra** within the college campus, while volunteers hoisted the national flag at their respective homes to express their deep-rooted patriotism on Independence Day.
- **28 August 2025:** Volunteers were actively encouraged to participate in an online survey hosted by the Ministry of Education to help develop mental health frameworks following the Supreme Court's directive.
- **30 August 2025:** An **Orientation and Volunteer Pledge Ceremony** was organized to introduce new members to the foundation and core values of the National Service Scheme.

### September 2025

- **4 September 2025:** A tree plantation drive titled "**Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam**" was held on the college campus, where volunteers planted saplings and committed to securing their long-term survival.
- **19 September 2025:** **International Peace Day** was observed with a poster-making competition themed "No War, Only Peace," where the top performers were recognized and awarded cash prizes.
- **24 September 2025:** **NSS Foundation Day** was celebrated with a fundraising drive for Punjab flood victims, the distribution of handmade cards to faculty, and a collective "Swachhata Hi Seva" pledge.
- **26 September 2025:** **The first one-day camp** was organized in Khokri village and the college campus, focusing on the themes of road safety awareness and building a corruption-free India.

## October 2025

- **2 October 2025:** To mark **Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti**, an **International Online Quiz Competition** was organized, drawing a massive participation of 2,582 individuals from across India and various other countries.
- **4 October 2025:** **The second one-day camp**, themed "Plastic Mukta Bharat," was conducted to educate volunteers on the importance of discipline, environmental cleanliness, and reducing plastic waste.
- **30 October 2025:** **The Fit India Freedom Run 6.0** was held under the theme "Swachhata and Swasthya" to promote health and fitness, with winners receiving trophies for their performance.
- **31 October 2025:** National Unity Day was celebrated with a "**Unity March Padyatra**" and the formation of a human chain involving chanting slogans of national integration.

## November 2025

- **4 November 2025:** Under the **Tobacco-Free Youth Campaign 3.0**, an anti-tobacco documentary was screened for volunteers to raise awareness about the health risks associated with tobacco consumption.
- **7 November 2025:** Following the directions of DGHE Panchkula, a collective singing of the **National Song "Vande Mataram"** was organized at CRSU, Jind, alongside a vibrant cultural program.
- **14 November 2025:** The closing ceremony of the Vande Mataram Song Week featured a final **group singing session** and the formation of a **human chain** representing the core message of national unity.
- **26 November 2025:** A signature campaign was launched to commemorate **Constitution Day**, reinforcing the commitment of students and staff to the fundamental values of the Indian Constitution.
- **29 November 2025:** An **NSS advisory committee meeting** was conducted to evaluate past activities and deliberate on the strategic planning of upcoming social service programs.

## December 2025

- **1 December 2025:** **World AIDS Day** was observed by tucking red ribbons onto students' lapels to foster a better understanding of the disease and show solidarity with those affected.
- **6 December 2025:** **The third one-day camp**, themed "Svasth Yuva Shashakt Bharat," included a cleanliness drive at the historical Bhuteshwar Temple and an awareness rally against drug abuse.
- **10 December 2025:** **World Human Rights Day** was celebrated with an essay writing competition on "Human Rights in a Changing India," with winners being honored with cash prizes.

## January 2026

- **3 January 2026:** A dedicated **volunteers' meeting** was held to brainstorm innovative ideas and discuss the execution of the upcoming winter special camp and other youth initiatives.

- **11-17 January 2026: Road Safety Week** was celebrated through the display of safety rules, a short video-making competition, and a national-level online quiz to promote responsible driving.
